Sunday of Meat-Fare

From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

A couple riddles for you (answer to the first is at the bottom of the page, but don't look just yet!). "Feed me and I live, give me something to drink and I'll die. What am I?" Here's another: "I grow when I'm given away, I die when I'm not given away. What am I?" The answer is *love*. When Christians live that love, things blossom. When they keep it to themselves, then the fruit dies on the vine. Today, we read about the dread and terrible Day of Judgement, the day of doom, when all things from all men at all times will be revealed for all to see. Each will be given an exacting judgement from He who cannot be deceived. Interestingly, as our Master and Lord, Jesus Christ, lays it out in this Gospel reading today we see that He will not judge us on great deeds done on a large scale. Rather, we will be judged by our love. (Love means concrete acts done selflessly for the ultimate good of another). We can do that in our own parish and by that, gain paradise. So, call or visit someone on the sick list. Our parish supports Natalia, a handicapped woman in Sambir, Ukraine. Can you give \$3 in the box at the back to feed and clothe her? Would you like to visit a local prison? Call Fr Jason and you can go with him. What about those poor women feeling abandoned to such a degree that they hand their babies over to be aborted? Jesus is there during the 40 Days for Life praying for and assisting those women. Come out and be counted. There are many ways to live out this divine love that God has given you through your Baptism.



Note that this parable is about one thing: *love*-- not a mere humanitarian concern for abstract justice and the anonymous "poor," but concrete and personal love for the human person, that God makes me encounter in my life.... The following is from Fr Schmemmann.... "Christian love is the 'possible impossibility' to see Christ in another man, whoever he is, and whom God, in His eternal and mysterious plan, has decided to introduce into my life, be it only for a few moments, not as an occasion for a "good deed" or an exercise in philanthropy, but as the beginning of an eternal companionship in God Himself. There is no "impersonal" love because love *is* the wonderful discovery of the "person" in "man," of the personal and unique in the common and general. It is the discovery in each man of that which is "lovable" in him, of that which is from God.

Not all of us are called to work for "humanity," yet each one of us has received the gift and the grace of Christ's love. We know that all men ultimately need this *personal love*-- the recognition in them of their unique soul in which the beauty of the whole creation is reflected in a unique way. We also know that men are in prison and are sick and thirsty and hungry because that personal love has been denied them. And, finally, we know that however narrow and limited the framework of our personal existence, each one of us has been made responsible for a tiny part of the Kingdom of God, made responsible by that very gift of Christ's love. Thus, on whether or not we have accepted this responsibility, on whether we have loved or refused to love, shall we be judged. For "inasmuch as you have done it unto one of the least of these My brethren, you have done it unto Me..."

Sisters seek volunteers for Ukraine in 2016: After last year’s successful English catechetical camp in Skole, Ukraine, the Sisters of St. Basil the Great have been invited to organize similar week-long camps in four different areas of Ukraine: Ivana-Frankivsk, Zutomyr (near Kyiv), Mukachev and Lviv. Sister Ann Laszok, OSBM and Sister Joann Sosler, OSBM, and their accompanying volunteers will collaborate with the Basilian Sisters and seminarians in Ukraine to hold these English language catechetical camps.

In order to hold these camps for the children (ages 10 to 16), the Sisters are seeking volunteers to teach English (i.e. basic grammar, reading, writing and/ or pronunciation, etc). Room & Board will be supplied for the volunteers but they are asked to pay for their own airfare. Volunteers may come for one, two, or three weeks. Depending on the number of volunteers participating and camps held, the Sisters will also visit orphanages and psychiatric institutions.

This year’s Basilian Volunteer Program is tentatively scheduled from May 27 to June 27, 2016, and will be limited to humanitarian efforts in Western Ukraine.
